Sunday School Sundays, 9:30 - 10:30 a.m.

Every Sunday the Epiphany class gathers to learn about God's grace and love. Using specially designed curriculum, students are taught Bible stories that provide a foundation to feel and understand God's love for each one of us. Once a year, the students design and lead a worship service for the entire congregation. The class is led by trained volunteers who have a heart for those with special needs. A registered nurse also participates with the students.

Life Skills and Art

Sundays, 10:30 a.m. - 2:30 p.m. (Bring your own brown bag lunch.)

Participants expand their social skills by expressing their artistic talents and interacting with friends. They enjoy activities such as drawing, recreation, yoga/relaxation, visiting on-site library, cooking, painting, drama, and music. Guest speakers teach practical topics such as nutrition, personal safety, transportation, health, and wellness. The class is led by a certified special needs teacher, trained volunteers, and a registered nurse.

Participants are welcome to come to one or both Sunday programs. Sunday School requires no registration. Registration and a \$50 per person activities fee is due in August and January for Life Skills and Art. Scholarships are available. Please register at www.phpc.org/epiphany.
